Introduction:

The Lighthouse Club is delighted to present its Construction Conference 2012 on the subject of "Collaboration and Cooperation in Contracts for Hong Kong's Expanding Infrastructure".

During recent times it has become generally accepted within the construction industry that collaboration and cooperation in contracts encourages better performance and avoids disputes compared to traditional forms of contract which invariably result in confrontation and dispute. Or is this the general view? In fact most projects are still carried out on the basis of traditional forms of contract, not just in the private sector but also most Government, Housing Authority and MTR Corporation projects are still carried out using their traditional standard forms of contract, many years after the Tang Report recommended the use of collaborative forms of contract such as NEC.

However, there is a trend towards collaboration and cooperation in contracts, albeit some may say progress is all too slow. The introduction of the DRA system has avoided disputes on traditional forms of contract that were once commonplace, target cost contracts have been introduced that rely on open book collaborative working and NEC has been introduced by Government, albeit on a trial basis.

Speakers from Government, MTR, Housing Authority and Consultancies will cover a range of initiatives aimed at encouraging collaboration and cooperation in contracts and providing the tools to assist in the achievement of these objectives.

Collaborative contracting should not just be about the use of collaborative contract forms, it should go much deeper than that to build a safer, healthier and more efficient, ethical, productive and viable construction industry through collaboration and cooperation. To promote these aspirations, this conference will also provide a platform for the introduction of "Hong Kong's Construction Industry Vision 2020, Building a City, Building a Society" prepared jointly by the Hong Kong Construction Association and the Construction Industry Group of the British Chamber of Commerce.
